TEACHING HISTORY:

Everett Community College (Everett, WA): Guest Instructor

February 7 – March 14, 2017

Physical Comedy: Students learn basic elements of Laban movement and Commedia dell'Arte to help them create fully realized physical characters. Elements of slapstick physical comedy (comedic takes, timing, lazzi, found object violence, running into doors, falling over furniture) are learned and incorporated into scene work.

Lakeside High School (Seattle, WA): Guest Instructor

February 2016

Slapstick Stage Combat: Students learn basic elements of stage combat (falls, slaps, punches, kicks) as well as elements of slapstick physical comedy (found object violence, running into doors, falling over furniture). Slapstick combat moves are then incorporated into scene work.

Everett Community College (Everett, WA): Guest Instructor

January 19 – March 2, 2016

Stage Combat: Students learn basic skills for the following weapons: Unarmed, Single Sword, Rapier & Dagger and Broadsword. Students will then apply these skills to a sequence of fight choreography for a stage fight scene from a classical or contemporary play.

Laban Movement for Performers:

Why do we move the way we do? What makes one movement more compelling than another? Rudolf Laban developed a system that distilled human movement into eight categories. This introductory level class is specifically geared towards performing artists who wish to create more dynamic physical and emotional movement on stage. Whether you are a dancer, an opera singer or an actor, you will gain greater awareness of your own physical habits and have fun filling your artistic toolbox with more movement options.

Winter 2013

Commedia dell'Arte: An overview of the history of this Italian performance genre. Students learn the various stock characters and work on brief mask and movement pieces for each character type.

Stage Combat: This workshop teaches the basic elements of unarmed stage combat to ages 11-18. Students learn elemental, non-contact moves like slaps, punches and kicks as well as a sequence of fight choreography.

Stage Combat: This workshop teaches the basic principles of unarmed stage combat. Students learn elemental, non-contact moves like slaps, punches and kicks as well as a sequence of fight choreography.

January 2006 to December 2007

TPS 1107 - Arts in Society, Theatre and Performance:

Through an examination of the role of arts in society, and an in-depth study of selected theatre and performance events, this interactive course provides an understanding of the creative process and develops skills in creativity and critical analysis. Heightened perceptual abilities will be developed through class experiences and field visits to a variety of arts events in dance, music, and visual arts, as well as in theatre and performance.

TPS 2203 - Acting 1, Principles of Acting:

The theory and practice of the actor's craft will be examined utilizing *The Practical Handbook for the Actor*. Students will perform scene work incorporating the basic principles. Attendance and written criticism of theatre and performance events required.

Piedmont College Department of Theatre (Demorest, GA): Adjunct Professor

August 2005 to October 2005

THE 210 - Fundamentals of Acting:

This course is an introduction to the skills necessary to build a character and play specific circumstances as well as an overview of the major acting teachers and their methods. It includes stage movement exercises and scene study. Written analysis required.

THE 405 - Acting Shakespeare: This is a participatory course that develops the skills required for performing Shakespeare. Course includes scene and monologue study as well as verse scansion.

THE 230 - Children's Theatre: This is a participatory course that emphasizes the importance of theatre for children. Students have the opportunity to create and interact with children through class projects both on and off campus.

Woodland High School (Cartersville, GA)

March 2005

Laban Movement: An introduction to the elements of movement created by Rudolf Laban. This workshop is specifically geared towards creating dynamic character and emotional movement for dancers to apply to a given piece of choreography.

Georgia Shakespeare

November 2004 to August 2009

High School Conservatory: Responsible for teaching a basic physical warm up, elemental principles of stage combat and directing scenes from Shakespeare for high school students (groups ranged from 12 to 24 students).

Laban Movement / Shakespeare Scene Study: An introduction to the elements of movement created by Rudolf Laban. Students learn to create dynamic physical characters. The course includes movement exercises and scene study.

Shakespeare from the Page to the Stage: An introduction to the basic principles of verse scansion. Students learn to investigate Shakespeare's texts for acting clues and then incorporate that knowledge into performance of monologues.

Actor's Express

September 2003 to December 2007

Comedic Scene Study: Students learn to incorporate both Laban movement techniques and the basics of *commedia dell'Arte* to create vibrant and physical comedic characters. The course includes movement exercises and scene study.

Shakespeare Monologues: Students learn the basic principles of verse scansion and apply them to a monologue they will develop as an audition piece.

Georgia Tech Drama Camp

July 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006

Stage Combat: This workshop teaches the basic elements of unarmed stage combat to children ages 5-13. Students learn elemental, non-contact moves like slaps, punches and kicks as well as a sequence of fight choreography.
